49258	McDermott	Patrick	Const	01/09/88	Clare	House at Ballygastin where the Sexton family live, on the night of 11th September, 1887, a desperate conflict took place between police and moonlighters, during which Head-Constable Whelehan* lost his life. He had information of the projected attack on Sexton, and lay in wait with a handful of police.
52206	McDermott	James	Const	12/05/19	Clare	For exceptional courage, promptitude and devotion to duty in successfully resisting an attack made by a party of 32 Sinn Fein Volunteers, arresting six of the party and dispersing the remainder. Owing to the suddenness of the attack, the assailants were able to disarm the two Constables, but Sergeant Donoghue, by his determined and gallant conduct, put the party to flight and succeeded in recovering the two captured rifles. The six men arrested were then marched through a hostile district for four miles to the nearest Police Barrack. During the attack several shots were fired on both sides

Robinson, Royal Irish Constabulary, for his gallantry during the defence of Inch Police Post, Clare, on 20 July 1919: "We did our duty to the best of our ability, and without fear, we will continue to do so."
65154	Fallon	Martin	Const	15/09/19	Clare	20th July 1919 attack at Inch: "Inch and Connolly Police Huts were attacked by men armed with guns and revolvers on last Sunday morning (20 July 1919). At Inch it is stated that the Sergeant and four constables were awakened at 3:30 a.m. by the explosion of a bomb which had been thrown through a front window. [To note, the reporter mixed up the total number of police and the total number of constables] later, more accurate reports confirm that a total of four R.I.C. were in the hut when it was attacked. Also, at this stage of the war the republicans were generally using homemade blast bombs, improvised from gelignite sticks and fuses stolen from farms and quarries, rather than military hand grenades.] Two more bombs were thrown in through a back window but they exploded between some boxes and did little damage. The police got their revolvers and fired on the party. The fire was returned and the fight continued for three quarters of an hour, after which the attacking party retired. None of the police was injured, but it is thought that one of the attackers must have been injured as a considerable quantity of blood was discovered on the ground where a number of empty cartridge cases were strewn."
